

Language:

1. **Addition Tables:** We say “Two and one are three, two and two are four,”
We always start with the number of the table we are teaching.

2. **Subtraction:** We say “six from eight leaves two, six from nine leaves three” In subtraction sums we use decomposition and regrouping throughout the school.

a. **Subtraction with Regrouping.**

When subtracting all pupils, parents and teachers are requested to use the following wording.

51
-23

51 take away 23 or 51 subtract 23.

We begin with the unit side.

RULE: ALWAYS START AT THE

BOTTOM

3 from 1 we cannot do.

So we bring over a ten from the tens side.

How many tens do we have now? 4

How many units do we have now? 11

- 2	3

REMEMBER BEGIN WITH THE UNITS

3 from 11 What does that leave?

3 from 11 leaves 8

(Now subtract the tens.)

T	U
5	1
- 2	3
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2	8

2 from 4 - What does that leave?

2 from 4 leaves 2.

We had 51 and we took away 23

Now what have we left?

We have 28 left.

3. **Multiplication Tables:** We say “Five twos are ten, five threes are fifteen”

4. **Division:** We say “two goes into six three times” or Two into eight goes four times, two into ten goes five times.”
