## Child Protection Training

New legislation on child protection has been enacted with new responsibilities for all groups (including schools) who work with children. We have been instructed by the Department of Education and Skills to take a half day on Friday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of March to go through the new information and plan for the new safeguarding measures that have to be put in place. I want to give as much notice as possible to parents in advance of this day. **The school will be closing at 12pm.**

## Maths Lesson Study

This month, we have had substitute teachers in six of our classes on three separate days. Some of the pupils said it was a "teacher swap!" The real reason is that our school was invited to take part in a Maths project in our school. The teachers (Mr. Flanagan, Ms. Gerrard, Mr. Ó Braonáin, Ms. Murphy, Mrs. Connor and Mrs. Johnson) were working with a Department of education facilitator. The teachers came together over two full days to ask a question relating to the teaching and learning of Maths. Then one teacher (brave Mrs. Johnson) taught the lesson in 2<sup>nd</sup> class and was observed by the others. Finally, the teachers came together to see if their question was answered in the lesson.

**Swimming** has begun for the four remaining classes in school for the spring term. Pupils in 5th and 6th classes rated their swim lessons very highly in a survey before Christmas as an activity they look forward to each year. **Rugby** coaching is taking place for four weeks for third and fifth classes with Robbie from Navan Rugby Club. They are practising skills and also taking part in tag rugby games

**Gaelic Football** coaching is taking place for first and second classes with Eoin from Slane GFC. He is also coaching boys and girls in 3<sup>rd</sup> class at lunchtimes. from Navan Education Centre for a two week trial period. Pupils in Ms. Murphy's third class have been trying them out. If all goes well, we hope to purchase a set of them for the school in the future.
